The Board of Directors were all in attendance.

Minutes:

Halt Violence received \$282, 450 from the Governors Violence reduction grant that Thell submitted for 2 years. With that, Halt Violence will hire 2 full time Street Mentors, a part time Street Mentor and a LSW case manager part time.

Halt Violence still awaits Ms. Owens from the Department of Youth Services for an update on receiving referrals for youth through the juvenile courts.

Halt Violence awaits a \$270,000 grant in with My Brother's Keeper through the City of Columbus.

Halt Violence placed a \$50,000 grant in with Pepsico Foundation

Curtis agreed to continue as a board member.

Halt Violence acknowledged that Thell made \$40.38 per hour in 2020, not 2022.

Halt Violence squashed 20 beefs that could of resulted in a fight, shooting or murder. 7 beefs are still on going and one unknown.

Halt Violence has 33 clients, 13 of them being youth.

Thus far this year, Halt Violence has raised **\$120,904.92.**

The board of directors voted that Thell will make \$55 per hour. He will scale back to 25 hours until we secure more funding.

Halt Violence placed a building permit with zoning to learn the maximum number of people we can have in our west location.

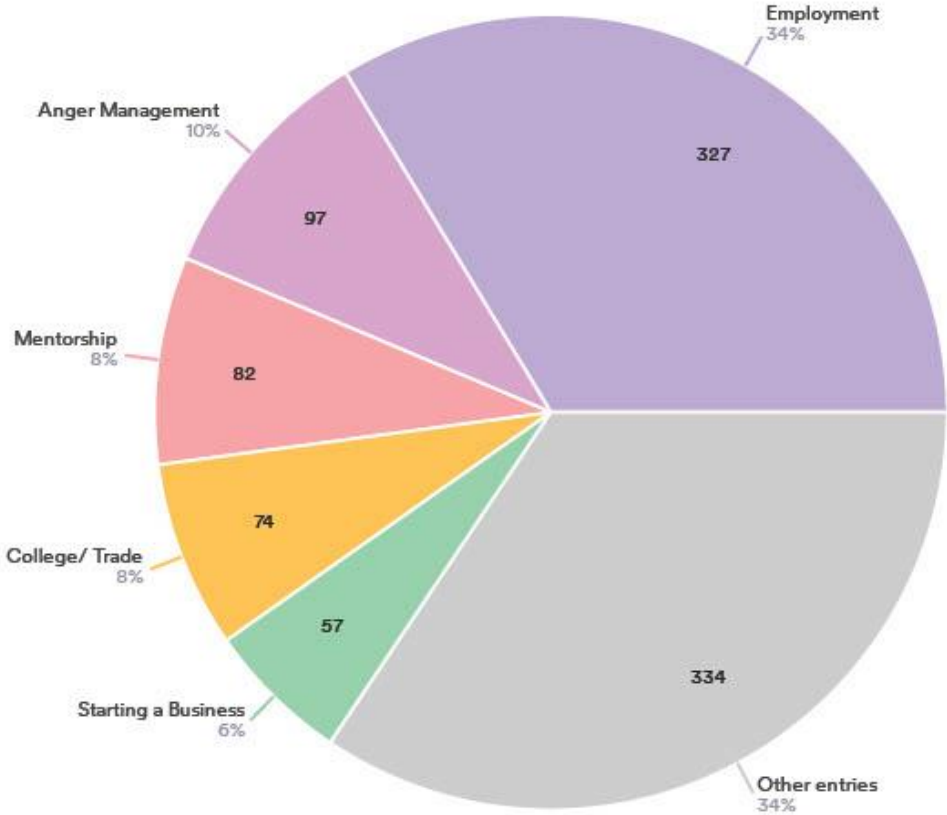

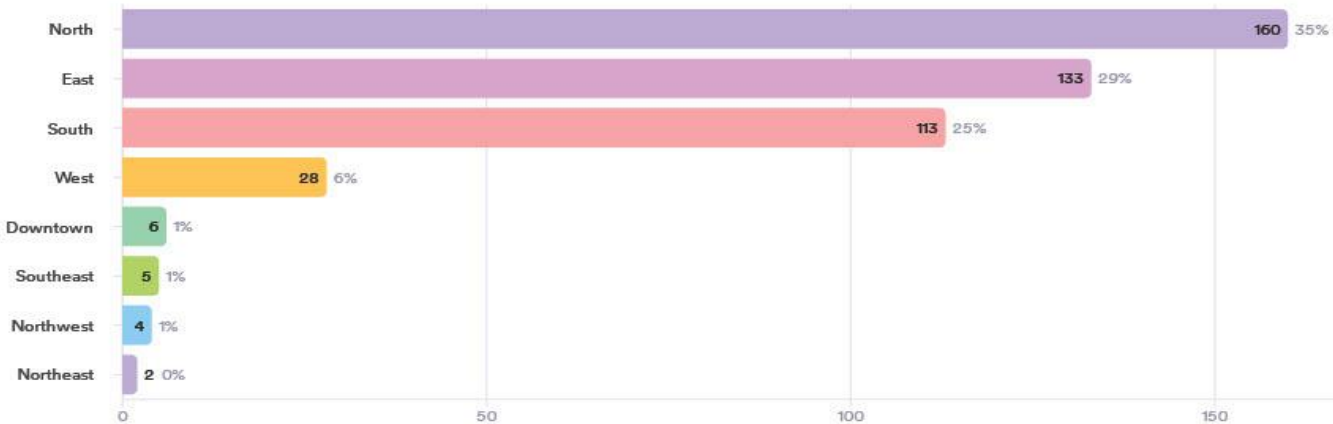
Halt Violence Service Planning

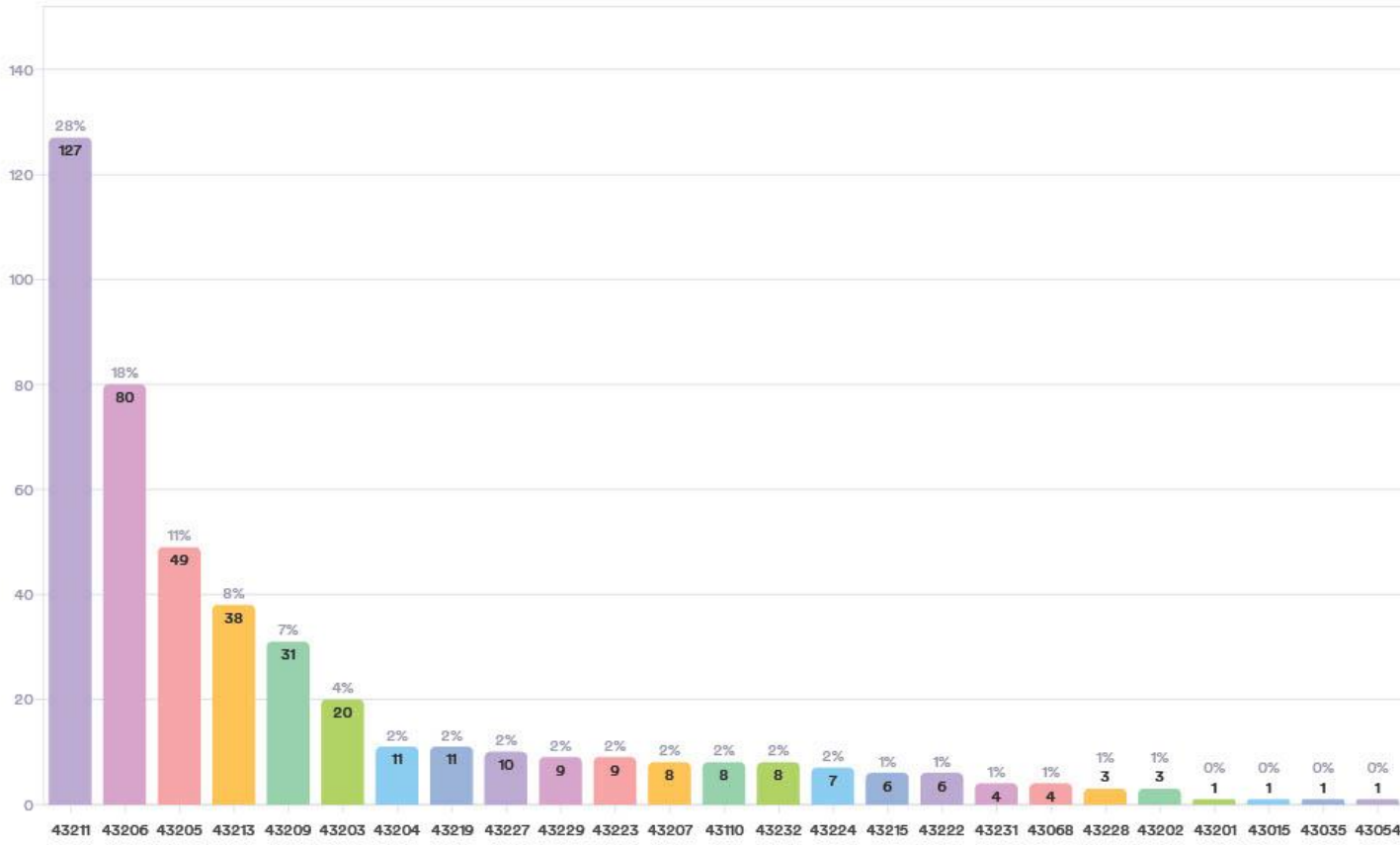

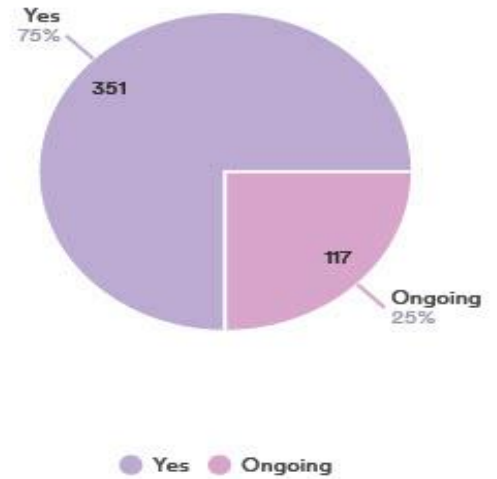
